MINUTES OF QUARTERLY MEETING

JANUARY 14, 2021

The annual meeting of the Camp Blount Historic Site Association was held at 5:00 PM on January 14, 2021 in the Fayetteville Municipal Building. President Randy Delap opened the meeting by greeting those in attendance. Eight directors were present. Directors Hamm, Towry, Mitchell, Waggoner, Wendt, Rael and Martinez were absent. Ex officio directors, City Manager Scott Collins, Chamber of Commerce Director, Carolyn Denton along with several Association members at large were also present.

Minutes of the November 12, 2020 meeting were read and approved by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer Ben Bedingfield reported the balance as of November 10, 2020 was \$23,557.91; balance as of January 14, 2021 is \$52,393.70. There is one outstanding check at this time for Medallions and Stands in the amount of \$2,643.06. Earmarked funds in the balance are \$2,995 donated by TN Society of the SAR, Joseph Greer Chapter. A Detailed list of credits and debits is attached. The Report was unanimously approved.

Membership Director's Report:

Membership Director Gloria Meadows reported total membership is 187 of which 161 are charter members. Total Membership monies collected is \$58,710. The Report was unanimously approved. There seems to be continued interest in charter memberships, so it was decided to continue accepting these for the time being.

City of Fayetteville Update:

Scott Collins reported phase 1 and 2 of the city greenway project has been completed and is now in the planning stage of phase three which will connect Stone Bridge Park with Camp Blount by way of a pedestrian bridge across Elk River. Six of the information stations have been installed in Camp Blount with five more to be erected in the near future. Also planning for walk ways and additional lighting and power continues as the number one priority. Maintenance of the grounds will continue as usual.

Cabin Committee Update:

Director Colin Wakefield reported that some suitable logs have been located for replacement of deteriorated sections of the cabin. Erection site preparation is being planned at present.

Other Business:

Work continues on charters and reports

At the last meeting a motion was approved to declare the second weekend of October as an annual historical event. With programs to include living history events, speakers, and display of period artifacts. Planning for this event continues with choosing a name that includes "Tennessee Volunteer" is a priority.
